September 12-19, 2010**

The Session calls all communing members of Second Presbyterian Church in good standing to give prayerful consideration in preparation for participation in the important responsibility given to the church of electing godly men to the office of deacon. There are (5) vacancies to be filled for the class of 2014.

All deacon nominees must meet the requirements of Holy Scripture, the PCA Book of Church Order, and Second Presbyterian Church (SPC). Deacons must be men who are:

- ◆ Believers who hold the deep truth of the faith with clear conscience (1 Tim. 3:9)
- ◆ Of spiritual character (BCO 9-3)
- ◆ Worthy of respect (1 Tim. 3:8)
- ◆ Temperate in consumption (1 Tim. 3:8)
- ◆ Sincere (1 Tim. 3:8)
- ◆ Honest (1 Tim 3:8; BCO 9-3)
- ◆ Of spiritual character (BCO 9-3)
- ◆ Exemplary in life (BCO 9-3)
- ◆ Brotherly in spirit (BCO 9-3)
- ◆ Warm towards other members (BCO 9-3)
- ◆ Of sound judgment (BCO 9-3)
- ◆ Member of Second Presbyterian Church for at least 2 years at the time of election (SPC)

"Likewise deacons must be reverent, not double-tongued, not given to much wine, not greedy for money, holding the mystery of the faith with a pure conscience." (1 Timothy 3:8-9)

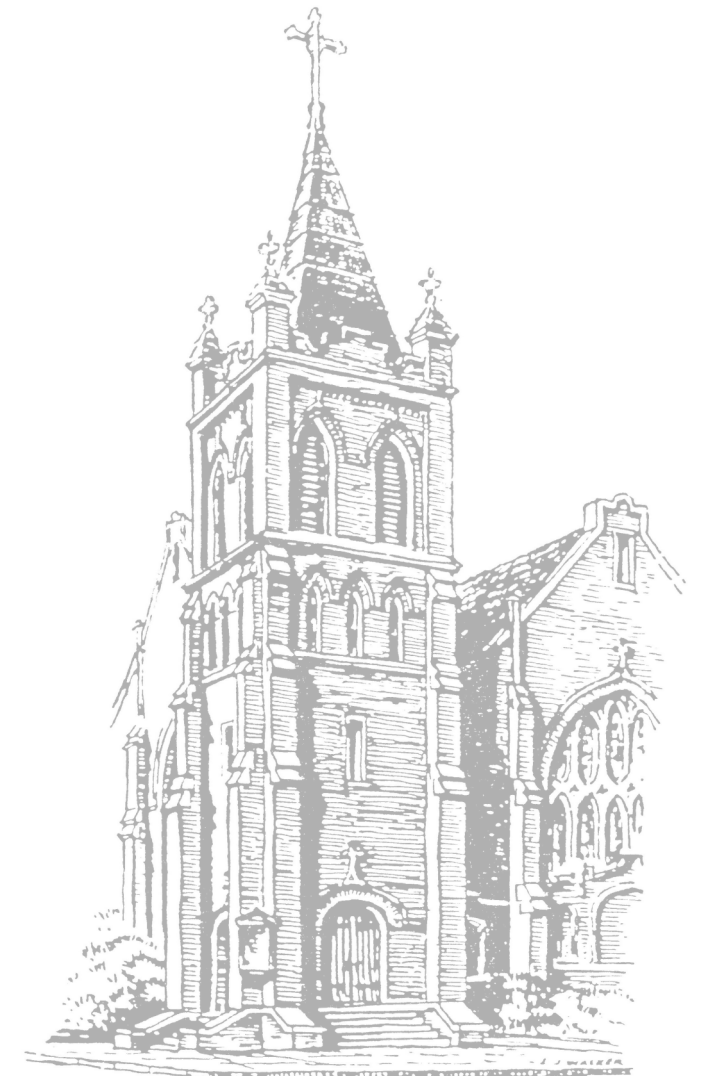

Nomination forms may be placed in the offering plate or submitted to the Church office anytime during the intervening week. Each member will be asked to sign the nomination form. Unsigned forms will not be considered.
