In short, I have learned how to be a pastor at Second Presbyterian Church. That is a rare gift that few men receive today. It is only because of the love and Christian nurture that my family and I have received at Second that we are bold enough to venture in faith to Philadelphia.

I do not know what the Lord has planned for us when I finish my studies at Westminster Seminary. I do know that if He should be pleased to call me back to the pastorate, there will be people who will benefit from what you have given me and my family. Your ministry to us will bless those whom you will never meet. Your ministry to us will be an epistle to others of God's mercy and grace.

In closing, I also know that no one reading this wants to give the glory to Second or her people. The most important thing I have learned from our church is that the glory of God is all that matters. From the preaching to the worship to CAT kids to Session meetings to beach trips, the constant current and undertow of God's glory in His precious Gospel has been a mighty river under us. We, as a congregation, are failures, all of us. This is precisely why we need the Gospel. This is why we come to Second: because failures can hear about grace and glory and hold each others' hands on the way to both.

Thank you, all of you. We love you and your place among us as a family is dear. Our children will hear of you and we look forward to embracing you again after we leave, whether in this age or in the age to come in front of the Savior, for Whom alone we have striven to serve you and to Whom you have pointed us. Final Assistant Minister's Letter

This Sunday, July 25, will be the last Sunday for Callie, Garner and me at Second Presbyterian Church. It is therefore with anticipation and sadness that I write this final letter to you, the congregation of Second Church. To use a cliché, it is bittersweet.

Over the past six years at Second, I have learned so much that I hesitate to even begin to try to put it into words in the brief space allotted to me. However, I do want to give a few final thoughts as we prepare to move to Philadelphia.

Second Church has been the site of the four most important events in our life. To begin with, this church is the first evangelical, Reformed church that Callie and I have ever been a part of. Second (no pun intended!), we were married here. Third, our first child was baptized here. Fourth, I was ordained to the Gospel ministry here.

So, the most significant events of our lives are bound up on the corner of River and Rhett streets. This is a major reason that the thought of leaving causes my wife and me to choke up. We can never think back on major life events without thinking of Second Church.

As a minister, I have learned that one can love the truth and also love people. Doctrine and practice are not antithetical but symbiotic. One of the privileges of ministering in a church like Second is that there are people who are both older than my parents and younger than our Garner and everyone in between. So one gets the spectrum of what it means to be truly human: the joy of new births (spiritually and physically), the pain of death and the excitement of youth ministry. I am grateful for all of it.

To the senior highs, with whom I have spent the majority of my time here at Second Church, I want to express the joy I have experienced in ministering to you. You have been very patient with me and I thank you for that. You have taught a former college pagan that Wednesday night is more exciting than Friday or Saturday night ever could be. You have taught me that some of the
