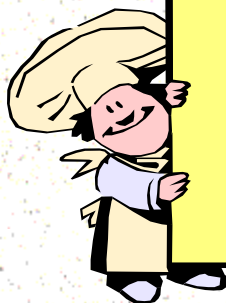

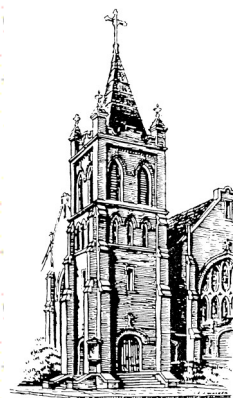

Letter From Church Administrator In Praise of a Personal Invitation to Come to Church

Dear Congregation,

Let me tell you a story. About 55 years ago a young man from Union, SC was new to our town. He liked Greenville because it was a beautiful place to live and work, surrounded by friendly people in a dynamic community that was healthy and prospering in those post-War years of Eisenhower's America. His company needed him to start a regional office in the Upcountry and so he happily moved here. Having grown up in the Presbyterian Church he started visiting congregations in the area looking for the right church to call home.

One day a new friend invited him to come to a Sunday School sponsored event at the Second Presbyterian Church. He accepted the personal invitation because he liked the friend and he still had not found the right place to call his church home. He came on Palm Sunday and enjoyed a hearty breakfast meal, bible-teaching and worship. The young man was welcomed immediately by the people he met and felt included within the church family. People spoke to him and inquired where he was from and asked him what brought him to Greenville. He made friendships. He felt at home. He would often say later that his first impressions of the people of Second Church were that they "acted like a real church," with authentic sacred worship and a family oriented congregation full of godly people who were friendly and (yes) even fun. In those years the church was beginning to change theologically for the better, especially a few years later after the arrival of a new minister named Gordon Reed. The church was becoming more biblical and conservative in response to the drift in the old Southern Presbyterian Church. This helpful trend was especially appealing to our young man, who knew that biblical Christianity was the only anti-dote to the rising tide of modernity.

Well the rest of the story is my own history, The young man in question, if you haven't guessed already was my own late father, J. Ligon Duncan, Jr. and he soon joined Second Church. A few years later he met and married a Furman music professor named Shirley (who was Baptist at the time but that's a whole another story) and settled down to raise three sons within this congregation. I've often thought about how important to my Dad's whole life that a member of this church reached out to a stranger, befriended him and invited him to church. Its really no different today with us is it?
