and good relations with unbelievers. Along the way, Paul explains his own motives in ministry so that the believers can recognize an authentic servant of Christ. This upbeat message is why I am attracted to preaching 1-2 Thessalonians, since Paul provides a biblical definition of a good church and then writes about how a good church should grow spiritually. In my view, Second Presbyterian is also a good church, so Paul's exhortations for spiritual growth will be good for us to consider.

First Thessalonians is also noteworthy for its important teaching about the Second Coming of Jesus Christ. Paul wanted these Christians living in a hostile world to ground their hope in Christ's return, just as we need to be taught to do the same. In my view, studying this teaching in 1 Thessalonians 4:1-5:11 will make a constructive impression in many of our lives. In Second Thessalonians, written shortly after the first letter, Paul wants to correct errors about Christ's return. He wants to make sure the believers are not deceived into thinking that Christ has already returned and reveals that "the man of lawlessness" (2:3) must first appear. In this context, Paul gives important teaching regarding the Antichrist and spiritual warfare with Satan. Too often, Reformed Christians neglect the Bible's teaching on the return of Christ, but it is important that we understand what the Scriptures tell us. Paul also emphasizes the victory of Christ through the final judgment after his return in glory, another theme with which Christians are to be familiar, and gives vital counsel on how Christians should grieve for those we love who have died.

In summary, then, the main themes of 1-2 Thessalonians are: 1) what is a good church and what should a good church be doing? 2) what is a godly ministry and how should believers respond to it? and 3) what should we believe about the return of Christ and why is it (along with the final judgment) so important to our present lives? Sprinkled alongside these themes are some of the most valuable pastoral observations and instructions from Paul to a wide variety of issues in Christian living and church health.

I hope you are as excited as I am about our upcoming series on First and Second Thessalonians. I would suspect that many in our congregation have never studied these important books and I look forward sitting under the apostle Paul's ministry as the Holy Spirit brings the Bible to life among us today. Please be in prayer for me as I study and preach, and pray for God to grow our church while directing our hearts forward to the great day when Christ returns in victory to gather His church. "Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together... in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will always be with the Lord" (1 Thess. 4:17).

Letter From The Senior Minister To the Thessalonians

Starting this coming Sunday (August 21), I will begin preaching through the letters from the apostle Paul to the church in Thessalonians. I believe that God blessed our studies in the Psalms (which will continue in the evening services after finishing 2 Samuel), but it is time to get back to the New Testament. Having preached through the Gospel of John from 2007 -2010, I thought it good for us to study some Pauline writings and 1-2 Thessalonians is one of my favorite sections of Paul's letters.

The Thessalonian letters are among the oldest of the New Testament documents, with only Galatians likely having been written earlier. We are able to date 1-2 Thessalonians with a high degree of accuracy, since we know that Paul wrote them after his short stay in Athens (1 Thess. 3:1), which means the Thessalonian letters were penned in A.D. 50 or 51 (dates extracted from Acts 18:12's reference to Gallio as proconsul in Corinth). Most scholars believe that Paul had been disheartened by a succession of difficulties and apparent failures in Greece. Beginning with a good start in Philippi, where Lydia and others came to faith, Paul soon had to depart because of violent opposition to his ministry. Paul and Silas traveled to Thessalonica, where Paul preached in the synagogue and gathered some Jewish converts. The unbelieving Jews responded by forming a mob which put the city in an uproar and forced Paul to leave after only a short stay. Next, Paul preached in Berea, where the Jews from Thessalonica followed him and forced him to keep moving. In the great city of Athens, Paul preached his powerful Mars Hill sermon, yet only a few believed (Acts 17:34). We read in 1 Thessalonians 3:1, Paul sent his protégé Timothy back to Thessalonica to check on the small church he had left in that city, while Paul moved on to Corinth. Before long, Timothy rejoined Paul and Silas with the joyous news that the believers in Thessalonica were doing well. Paul writes that he is encouraged "because our gospel came to you not only in word, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction" (1 Thess. 1:5).

How greatly it would have lifted Paul's heart during such a trying time to learn that his labors had resulted in a strong and growing church! It was in order to express his thanks and offer his encouragement that Paul wrote his first letter to the Thessalonians. Given this purpose, this is one of Paul's more upbeat letters, in contrast to letters like Galatians and 1-2 Corinthians where Paul is writing to rebuke and correct error. In 1 Thessalonians, Paul writes to a church that is off to a good start and urges them to take the next steps, which consist of moral purity, brotherly love,
