Some of the major topics covered include: communication, safety, preparedness, appropriate security measures, existing security strategy, transportation for the disabled, notification, public statements on behalf of the church, ministry to those who have been traumatized by the event and even "what constitutes an emergency."

Here is a representative sample of the consensus from all our officers firstly it is agreed that we do not have a communication problem or communication breakdown between church staff, deacons and elders. Those who needed to know about pastoral care situations, acted promptly when a threat to the safety of the church occurred. With regards to safety - absent a new threat to the church or a member of the church there is no good reason to hire security officers on Sundays/Wednesdays. We do not want to over react and militarize the campus because of an isolated incident. With regards to "preparedness" while there is always a need to improve, the officers are confident that we have a good existing plan which we continue to work on. Long term issues related to our wheel-chair bound members have been referred to the Long Range Planning Committee. They are already making plans to address known "American with Disability Act" (ADA) issues within our building and campus. The Session with and through the Senior Minister will authorize and make any public statements on behalf of the church. These are ordinarily done only in response to specific requests from legitimate parties. We have work left to do on preparedness issues and hope to do so in the coming months.

In conclusion we certainly wish to express that the officers of Second Presbyterian are working to make our facility a place of safety for all who come inside our doors. Please do not hesitate to ask your Fold Elder or your Pastor questions and express to us *any* concerns you may have.

To all who are spiritually weary and seek rest; to all who mourn and long for comfort; to all who struggle and desire victory; to all who sin and need a Savior; to all who are strangers and want fellowship; to all who hunger and thirst after righteousness; and to whoever will come; this church opens wide her doors and offers her welcome in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ.



Letter from the Chairman of the Diaconate and the **Chairman of Session's Administration Committee**

Dear Church family,

A few weeks ago our Senior Minister wrote a note to the congregation that was posted initially on our church website and then on the Facebook page. Here is part of that message...

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort" (2 Cor. 1:3). I want to give praise to God for His protection of our congregation during the frightening events of last Sunday morning (Sept 4th) and also for the grace He has shown to members who are in distress. Together with all of you, I deeply grieve the actions of our dear friend and the loss of his life. May God comfort each of you according to your particular need through the ministry of His Holy Spirit.

I want to encourage our members not to be afraid to return to the church building or sanctuary. If you are particularly distressed, please let us know so that we can minister to you. This is a time for us to show our faith in the Lord. God will protect us. By means of the peace He gives and the faith that answers our fears, we have an opportunity to bear testimony to God's faithfulness as the Protector of His people. Meanwhile, the elders and deacons will be discussing the lessons we should learn from this incident and will inform you of any safety precautions or procedures we deem necessary. Please feel free to share your concerns with us or to ask any questions as you may have them.

An incident like this reminds us of how precious our church family is to all of us. It calls us to love one another in the grace that God gives. It calls us to greater fervor in prayer. And it calls us to give thanks to the Lord, who neither slumbers nor sleeps but guards His people, watching over our "going out and coming in, both now and forever" (Ps. 121:4, 8).

The officers of the church have met on this matter "jointly" (all the deacons and elders together) twice to conduct a thorough examination of issues related to safety and security within the congregation and on the church campus. Individual officers, relevant committees and staff have met numerous times and will all continue to meet to review the matter. The formal work of safety and security review began on the afternoon of Sept 4th and then with a joint meeting on September 7th a thorough review of concerns and a self evaluation of our response to recent events occurred. The overall assessment was that we had a good response from pastors/officers to an isolated act of violence on our church campus and that no major recommendations need to be made to existing policy or procedure at this time.
