exception to this rule, born of the Holy Spirit as the true Son of God. Jesus came to fulfill all righteousness on our behalf and to pay the penalty of our sins by dying in our place, all so that sinners might be made righteous in God's sight through faith in Him. It is for this reason that Zechariah 9:9 says of him: "Your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation." This is why we hail Jesus as our King, welcoming Him into our hearts as the hosannas once hailed him entering Jerusalem.

Palm Sunday begins our week-long observance that leads to next week's celebration of Easter Sunday. These are the most precious dates on the Christian calendar. This Thursday evening we will gather to remember the Last Supper of our Lord. It is called Maundy Thursday, for the Latin word meaning "commandment," recalling Jesus' loving ministry to us and His command for us to love one another. We will also have a Good Friday service, remembering the day of our Lord's death on the cross. All this will prepare our hearts for the great joy of the Resurrection morning. Our Easter observance will begin with a fifth-annual joint sunrise service, along with Segadores Mission Church, at 7:00 am at the Wyche Pavilion, located behind the Peace Center. This will be followed by a breakfast in the church gymnasium, Sunday School at 9:00, and our Easter Sunday morning service at 10:00. (We will only have one service on Easter Sunday.) I hope you will be able to participate in these events, setting apart time during this week to honor our righteous King who died and rose from the dead for our salvation.

Please invite people you know to join us, especially for the Easter morning worship service. The Bible says, "Faith comes by hearing the Word of Christ" (Rom. 10:17), and on Easter Sunday they will hear good news of salvation from a loving God. May the blessing of the righteous King be upon you during this holy week to come.

Report from March Session Meeting

The Session had its monthly meeting on March 11th. Dr. Phillips brought a devotion followed by a season of prayer for the congregation. The Session received a family into membership and heard reports from the Diaconate on property matters and SPC missionaries. Membership is 592 including 99 non-communicants. In the previous month 1 covenant child was born into our congregation, 2 covenant children were baptized. 4 members transferred their letters to other churches.

Individual staff members gave their monthly reports. Finance reviewed church fiduciary obligations. Media presented new design for *West End Herald*. Missions brought information on the Summer Missions Programs. Pastoral Care gave updates on congregation needs and individual ministry situations. Worship & Music detailed the Easter Sunrise service and proposed further updating of the Wedding Policy.

Report from March Diaconate Meeting

The Diaconate had its monthly meeting on March 4^h. Mr. Duncan (Session Liaison) brought a devotion followed by a season of prayer for the congregation.

Building & Property brought information on: Daily Maintenance issues, Gym Repair, Mulching, Parking Lot repaving (when weather warms up), Trees on the grounds (Rhett Street side). Plans are being developed to update the Fellowship Hall. Fellowship & Athletics reviewed the most recent winter sports season and Easter special events planning. Pastoral Letter Behold, Your King!

"Rejoice greatly, O Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey." Zech 9.9

This Lord's Day we remember the day our Lord Jesus entered into Jerusalem for the final week of his ministry here on earth. We call it Palm Sunday to remember the reception Jesus received as he entered the holy city. People in the crowd spread palm branches before Jesus to acknowledge him as the Savior. Jesus came to his people as the true King and as the Lamb of God. Let us open our hearts to Him today, calling upon Him as our Savior.

Zechariah's prophecy tells of the coming of a righteous ruler who will bring His people salvation. There is much talk today in America of what we need in our leaders. According to the Bible, the first qualification of a true leader and a real savior is righteousness. It is here that every human leader fails us, for the only truly righteous king is the Lord Jesus Christ. The foundation of any kingdom is righteousness, and Jesus is the one King who establishes a righteousness that is pleasing in God's sight, who is Himself perfectly righteous, and who is able to give righteousness to those who bend their knee and call Him Lord. The apostle Paul writes of mankind, "There is no one righteous, not even one" (Rom. 3:10). Jesus is the sole
