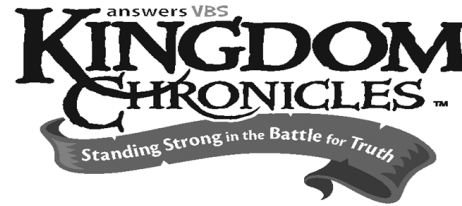

## **At the Corner of River and Rhett**

### BOY SCOUTS

On May 23<sup>rd</sup> the Boys Scouts of America issued this statement, "Today...National Council approved a resolution to *remove the restriction denying membership to youth on the basis of sexual orientation alone....* This policy change is effective Jan. 1, 2014, allowing the Boy Scouts of America the transition time needed to communicate and *implement this policy to its approximately 116,000 Scout-ing units.*" (italics from the Editor)

The SPC Scout Committee has reviewed the legal and moral issues related to the matter with our church sponsored Troop 828, and has had discussions with the leadership of Blue Ridge Council, Reedy Falls District and our own troop masters. The Session will consider the matter at its stated June meeting.

The question that every Christian church in America that sponsors a boy scout troop has to answer is does it wish to promote homosexuality as "morally straight" and allow an increasingly anti-Christian culture to normalize homosexuality in the scouting movement.

### DR. PHILLIPS ON THE ISSUE

"The Session of Second will meet to respond to this. I don't think it is going out on a limb in saying that we will not sponsor an organization that declares that homosexuality can be considered morally straight or that, at least at the level of policy, would send eleven year-old boys out into the woods with homosexual seven-teen year-olds. What a lamentable situation. My prayers are especially with you men who have given so much under this once noble banner."

"I am hopeful that some BSA alternative organization might become a home for Troop 828. And perhaps I should clarify that when I say it is unlikely that our church will support Boy Scouts, that does not mean that we will not support Troop 828. I will look forward to conversations about the options that are available to us."

# The Reverend Paul Gunter Settle

Doctor of Divinity

*conferred May 23, 2013*

The Reverend Paul G. Settle was born in Charleston, West Virginia, in 1935, to a wonderful Christian family. Under the gentle influence of his maternal grandfather, whom he endearingly called "Pop," Reverend Settle professed faith in Christ at five years of age.

Throughout high school he worked various jobs in order to save toward an education in medicine, and eventually his dreams began to come to fruition as he enrolled as a pre-med major at West Virginia University. However, through the witness of some friends at Princeton Seminary, the call of the Holy Spirit, and the precious prayers of his family, he felt the compelling call to the ministry and left West Virginia to attend Bob Jones University in South Carolina.

On the first day of enrollment at Bob Jones University, Reverend Settle was escorted to the dining area for lunch. Taking the only empty seat available, he found himself right next to the most vivacious, captivating girl from Kentucky by the name of Georgia Brown. He was indeed smitten! Three and a half years later they were married and blessed with fifty four tremendous years together before Georgia went home to be with the Lord after a long battle with Alzheimer's disease. They have two terrific children, Paul David and Joe Lynne.

Reverend Settle was ordained as a teaching elder in the Kanawha Presbyterian Church in the United States in 1959, and faithfully served churches in West Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Alabama and Florida. During his years of pastoral service, Reverend Settle also filled various important roles. He served as Executive Secretary of Presbyterian Churchmen United and Executive Director of the Continuing Presbyterian Church which soon became the Presbyterian Church in America. In fact, the first office of the Continuing Presbyterian Church was actually located in his very own garage in Montgomery, Alabama.

Reverend Settle was moderator of the PCA General Assembly in 1980 and coordinator of the Church Education and Publications Committee when it began a fruitful joint venture with the Orthodox Presbyterian Church. He was chairman of the Ad-hoc Committee on Joining and Receiving through whose efforts the PCA and the Reformed Presbyterian Church, Evangelical Synod were joined, bringing into the PCA Covenant College and Covenant Theological Seminary.

Reverend Settle served as a faithful and active member of Westminster Theological Seminary's Board of Trustees for twenty-five years. He has been a true humble servant and stalwart of the faith throughout his years of ministry.

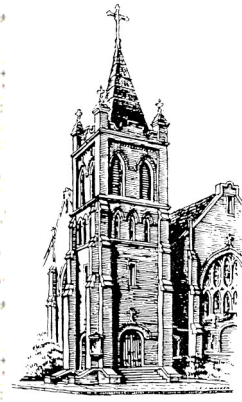
