health; he takes care of many of his worldly affairs and wants as much as possible to help him with whatever problems he may be keeping private. When Frodo volunteers to go on a great quest Sam does not hesitate to volunteer himself along "to keep an eye on Frodo" because he's personally committed to Frodo though he has not the faintest clue what it will mean for him. Sam is motivated primarily by a sense of love.

Frodo on the other hand is keenly motivated by his sense of duty. When he discovers that a family heirloom is something much more than just an ordinary ring he volunteers out of a sense of obligation to take the ring to its place of origin and destroy it for the good of all. He famously concludes, "I will take the ring... though I do not know the way." For Frodo finishing the task that was laid before him was the motivation he needed to start the job.

Love and duty conjoined are both helpful and *biblical* motivations for Christian people to serve in the Church. One can't help but marvel at the number of people at the Second Presbyterian Church who use their God-given gifts to the benefit of others. It's a joy to work with many of you each week and see the ways you are sharing your gifts with others while you serve the Lord Jesus in this place. I am amazed at how much practical kindness and generous helpfulness that I see each day in the lives of our church family.

I know some feel that your gifts are limited. They aren't! You don't know where to plug in; you don't know how to connect. That's OK. The Lord has known you all the days of your life, he knows your motives, your desires, and he also knows that if you use your gifts, you will be a blessing to someone else. Your pastors would love to talk with you about this. Helping people "find a sense of place" is one of the most joyful conversations you can have with your pastor at church.

I recognize that for many our ability to share our talents is done out of a dutiful spirit and Christian work is often dutiful in its scope. We have been given an expression of God's love within us, it would be unwise and unhealthy to stifle our God-given gifts, whatever they are – to sing, to build, to hold, to listen, to teach, to visit. As our Minister of Congregational Care often exhorts us "don't withhold a blessing for others." I commend you to dutifully examine your own gifts and consider what you might be withholding that should be shared

with the Church. Duty is a helpful reminder that strengthens our Christ-wrought convictions. Christian duty is ultimately an expression of Christ's resolve and not ours. Throughout scripture we see many examples of redeemed people properly motivated by love, often time love producing a sense of duty and vice versa.

It's very interesting to discover in the very end of *The Lord of the Rings* as Frodo and Sam approach the apex of their great adventure something very interesting happens in their relationship. Their motivations have reversed; Frodo is now wholly dependent on Sam's newfound sense of duty to the quest and Sam likewise is strengthened by Frodo's renewed love for Sam. Sam has done his duty and becomes arguably the hero of the story through patiently and faithfully loving a friend in need. Frodo at the end of the story has been reduced almost entirely to his love for Sam. Frodo learned love by doing his duty.

As you serve Christ, I do hope every member of Second Church will share with others that expression of Christ within them. Whether you are "dutifully loving" or "loving dutifully" may God renew your motivation to finish what He has begun.

PCA PRISON MINISTRIES

We enjoyed hearing yesterday from Mark Casson, PCA Prison Ministry Coordinator. Here is some more information:

The actual work of prison ministry is done by people just like you. Instructors, those who correspond with prisoners, the mentors, and those who work with the prisoners as they reintegrate into the community — are mostly PCA members, offering this ministry as a service by primarily PCA churches. Metanoia provides a curricula, training and logistical coordination to assist churches in initiating and sustaining this ministry. Any adult Christian can serve as an instructor. We encourage people to become instructors and do the ministry as a family. Based on my personal experience in ministry with prisoners, I commend to you the ministry structure offered by (PCA Prison Ministry) Metanoia.

Thought for the Day

The Golden Chain

"Those whom he predestined he also called, and those whom he called he also justified, and those whom he justified he also glorified" (v. 30).

- Romans 8

After describing our struggle with the flesh after conversion (Rom. 7), Paul in Romans 8 talks about some of the benefits that result from our justification. This chapter is well-known for its description of life in the Spirit and its discussion of the ordo salutis — the order of salvation (vv. 28–30).

Although Paul does not deal with sanctification per se, he does include God's work of conforming us to His Son in his golden chain (v. 29). Note also that our adoption as joint-heirs with the Savior (8:14–17) is the starting point for Paul's initial foray into predestination and election in the ordo salutis (vv. 28-30) and his detailed presentation of these topics in chapters 9–11. We may try to look at election in a manner unconnected from practical realities, but Scripture locates this doctrine in the Father's great love for His people, a love that moved Him to make us His children. Divine election is preached wrongly if it is not preached as a comfort to believers and as a call to reflect God's glory. It grounds our hope in God's working all things together for good for those who love Him (v. 28).

As Dr. R.C. Sproul tell us, all Christians believe in some form of predestination because Romans 8:28-30 and other passages (Mal. 1:2-3; Eph. 1:11-12) teach that God has chosen some people for salvation. The question is, upon what basis does He make His choice? Does the Lord "look down the corridors of time" and then choose those whom He knows in advance will respond to the gospel? Or, does He set His special, salvific love on some, a love that guarantees that they will trust Christ? Much could be said in response, but most important is the fact that divine foreknowledge as taught in Scripture has to do with the Father's decision to set His affection upon His elect. God's foreknowledge certainly includes His knowledge of how a person will act, but to be known by God (Gal. 4:9) means primarily to be loved by Him in a special way. We love Him because He first loved us (1 John 4:19), and God's particular love leads particular people to follow Jesus. A future decision of ours is not the basis upon which our Creator loves us. He loved us first, otherwise we would never love Him.

Letter from the Church Administrator **Love and Duty**

I would like to tell you about two friends of mine (from English literature) named Frodo Baggins & Samwise Gamgee. These two unexpectedly accomplished great things together out of two completely different senses of motivation. I think they have something to teach us about why we volunteer.

Other than the Bible JRR Tolkien's The Lord of the Rings may be the most read book in the English language (though Harry Potter is challenging). As a child a special memory was listening to the works of Tolkien read aloud (and in some cases reenacted) by my older brothers-something I now take great pleasure in doing with my own children. Many of you have a keen interest in Tolkien, his imaginary (and yet so seemingly real) world of Middle-Earth, his relationship with CS Lewis and involvement in Oxford's famous literary discussion group "The Inklings." Tolkien's stories are not to be understood as explicit Christian allegory like Lewis's world of Narnia, but throughout one will find redemptive metaphors and virtuous characters only understood by a fixed Christian world-view.

Now back to our two friends. Samwise & Frodo. "Sam" has worked for the Baggins family all of his life, as his father before him. He is a beloved employee, a neighbor, a frequent dinner companion, a confidante, and even an eager student of Frodo's (especially anything to do with Elves). Sam, in the best possible human sense - loves Frodo. He worries about his
