2014 Missions Conference



The Editor

Church History

Bethel Presbyterian Church Clover, York County, South Carolina

The Bethel Church was organized through the ministry of Rev. William Richardson in 1764 and it is the oldest P.C.A. church in the state. A site for the first building was selected when three men standing on a piece of land realized it was at the center of the area occupied by the members' properties. On that tract was built the first of what would be four churches.

Bethel was not able to call its first minister, Hezekiah Balch, until 1770. Rev. Balch continued at Bethel until 1776 when the dangers of the American Revolution led him to relocate. After Balch, a series of short-term ministers was ended when Rev. James S. Adams served for twenty-nine years beginning in 1811. He was a son of Bethel having been born just a few miles away. He retired from the church in 1840, died five years later, and was buried in the cemetery next to his wife, Erixene. The next minister was Rev. Adams's nephew, S. L. Watson. He was installed April 25, 1840, beginning what would be a forty-two year ministry. He resigned at the age of 84 and was later that year buried next to his wife, Nancy, in the church cemetery.

The next pastor, R. A. Webb, from Oxford, Mississippi, would go on after his Bethel ministry to teach first at South Western Presbyterian Seminary in Tennessee and then Louisville Presbyterian Seminary in Kentucky. While he was preparing for the ministry in Columbia Seminary, his interest in Professor Girardeau went beyond his lectures to his daughter, Sarah, whom he married in 1880. R. A. Webb was ordained and installed in Bethel Church in 1882 for a call that lasted six years. While at Bethel he compiled *History of the Presbyterian Church of Bethel* in 1887. After a few brief pastorates, he went on to his teaching work. He died in Louisville in 1919.

Bethel Church is in a lovely setting and its grounds, cemetery, and architecture provide a sense of the past. The lovely white building with its columns directs entering worshippers to the greatness of God. The 250th anniversary of Bethel is being celebrated this year with a history book available for purchase and a grand celebration on November 16 with Dr. J. Ligon Duncan, III, speaking.

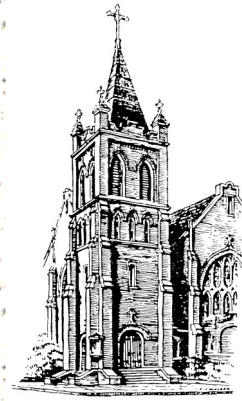

What You Need to Know

Children's Chapel (ongoing)

Each Sunday morning after the early service ends (approximately 9:55am) Dr. Richard Phillips guides children from 4 year olds through the 4th grade through the morning sermon theme. Bring your child to the sanctuary (or on some Sundays to the Chapel) and their teachers will take them to their Sunday School rooms.

College & 20's group beginning Sept 21st

John Duncan will begin teaching this class in the fall of 2014 on the topic of "How to Study the Bible."

This group will also have a complementing Wednesday night class taught by Pastor Spears on "Christian Manhood and Womanhood."

Covenant Kids / Junior High Sunday School

This year the 5th & 6th graders will be combined with the 7th & 8th graders for Sunday School, Jeff Windt will teach on Psalms Chapters 1-12. This class meets on the 3rd Floor of the Sanctuary Building in S-307.
