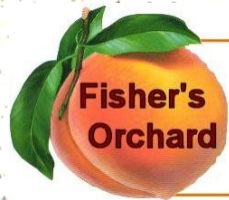
### Missionary Speaker

professions of faith, but true professions that are evidenced by a consecrated life to Christ and the bearing of spiritual fruit.

The Lord taught me much during the week and has continued to teach me since returning to Greenville. One of the highlights was worshipping with the Guatemalans on Sunday morning. There were about 150-200 people sitting elbow to elbow in this tiny church in Guatemala City. The singing was partly done in Spanish with some verses in English. The service was conducted in Spanish, with a translator from our team interpreting it for us. It was truly a picture that I had never seen before of Revelation 7:9-10: "After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, for all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" God truly does call people to Himself from every tribe, tongue, and nation. It was a joyous service, praising the risen Lord with my fellow brothers and sisters in Christ.

The Lord also showed me a tangible picture of true joy in Christ; not in the things of this world. I was deeply moved by the joy and sincere gratitude of the Guatemalan people. Most of them are impoverished and have very little materially. This was quite apparent one afternoon as our team walked down an alley filled with gangs to visit a local Guatemalan family. The "home" is unlike any I have ever seen. There were no doors and very little roof covering with chickens and rabbits running loose inside. There were only two beds, one for the grandmother and four kids; and the other for the aunt and two more kids. There was one sink...outdoor, but it looked more like an animal water trough. Some of the houses were not quite this meager, but most had shabby exteriors with steel doors and barbed wire to protect the homeowners from the gangs. Even though these people have nothing materially by our standards, the Guatemalan Christians have everything in Christ. They have set their minds on eternity and know full well the truth of 2 Corinthians 4:18: "As we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal." We have all we need in Christ too, but as American Christians, including myself, we get distracted with worldly concerns. We too often take our



focus off Christ, and put our focus on ourselves, whether it be work, family relationships, or just "stuff." My experience with the people of Guatemala was a sober reminder to be more joyful and thankful, knowing that our joy is not temporal, but eternal with our Savior.

Your prayerful support and encouragement was a constant blessing to me in my journey to Central America. I sincerely appreciate my church family for your genuine interest, prayers, and willingness to help my family while I was away. I would encourage all of you to prayerfully consider going on a mission trip. You will be challenged, but you will also come away changed. I give God all the glory for the Kingdom work that was accomplished for the sake of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

## The Kindness of the LORD to Paul Anderson

How grateful we are for the prayers and support of our Second Presbyterian Church Family, and the care of the Women in the Church "Koinonia" for the elderly to put their affairs in order. You reflect God's special kindness to us.

On Thursday, June 25th, in the ER of a Fall River, MA hospital, Paul spoke and prayed with a Deacon from the Christian Fellowship, the Reformed Portuguese Igreja, which shares Grace Presbyterian's building. When taken to ICU, Paul immediately suffered a large stroke and seizures, requiring heavy sedation and a ventilator. He could not be transferred in the night to Tufts Medical Center in Boston until a bed opened and then surgery Friday morning removed a large blood clot in his brain. The medical team did testing and aggressive therapy to stabilize Paul's condition. The long interval of delay before Tufts' availability had allowed extensive blood vessel damage and a relapse Friday night made Saturday a day of decision. After the required two apnea tests to see if Paul could breathe on his own, he could not. From a thousand miles away, we gave permission to withdraw the ventilator to allow Paul to go to Heaven. What a mercy of the LORD that Paul had never awakened and died without anxiety.

The funeral is on Friday, July 10th, 11 years to the day of Paul's ordination to Grace Presbyterian Church (OPC) in Fall River, MA., on John Calvin's birthday! (It was founded 60 years ago by G.I. Williamson, author of the study manual for the Westminster Confession of Faith.) As Fall River declined with the loss of textile mills moving south, the Grace congregation dwindled, but the few remaining families voted to stay open. They welcomed Paul, and all mutually came to love each other. Shortly thereafter came proof of one of God's gifts to Paul - integrity. A larger church in New England in need of a pastor, approached him with a fine offer, but he politely declined. He had been called by God to Grace Church and would not use as a stepping stone the flock God had entrusted to his pastoral care.

Paul loved all of God's Word, and wanted to preach more and more the Name of Jesus. And he felt the position of Pastor was God's highest calling for him. He always wanted to give God the Glory, great things He has done!

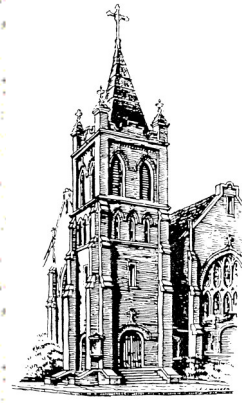

### Letter from Dr. Kevin Mobley Guatemala Mission Trip

After providentially learning of a chiropractic mission opportunity, I prayerfully considered the Lord's prompting and I left my comfort zone on June 19<sup>th</sup> for Guatemala. A healthcare mission has been on my heart for many years, and the Lord opened the door in His timing through the Christian Chiropractors Association and Caring Partners International (CPI). CPI is a Christian, non-profit agency that organizes medical mission trips to many different areas around the world. Their mission ministry spans over two decades. CPI coordinates with churches in different regions to set up health clinics which run for about one week. I traveled with 27 others on the team that represented different occupations, including teachers, nurses, a medical doctor, a dentist, a physical therapist, a pastor, and others. Team members that were not healthcare professionals helped in the eyeglass station, in security, and in playing with the children. The Lord brought approximately 1,400 people for us to serve in 4 ½ days in two different health clinics. One clinic was in the heart of a gang-infested urban area of Guatemala City, and the other in Parramos, a destitute, rural village north of the city. The people lined up for hours to receive the physical care they needed, and then went to the "Clinic for the Soul." This station that was run by members of the local congregation that were trained to present the gospel in their native language. Some claimed they already had a personal relationship with Christ, but 80 actually "professed a new faith in Christ!" The goal now is for the pastor and leaders of the church to meet with the eighty to disciple them, encourage them in the faith, and assimilate them into the local covenant body. My prayer for these new believers is that they would not have bare
