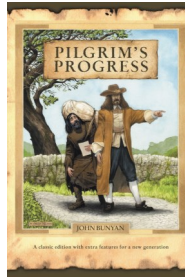

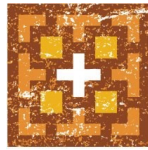

June Gallman, our missionary in Costa Rica, works with women in prison teaching them academics and life skills as well as spiritual lessons. When the women are released, the transition back to life outside of prison is difficult for them and their children. The Lord has enabled June to purchase a home which she intends to use to help with this transition. Its size is sufficient to house several of these women with their children from the time of their release from prison until they can obtain suitable housing.

June has purchased cots, and she needs bed linens and pillows to prepare for her house guests. In our VBS Bible Boot Camp this week, we want to see how many pillows and sets of sheets we can buy for her to use in this part of her missions. What a great way for us to be involved in this ministry of helping women who have been equipped with new life in Christ as well as skills for a new way to provide for themselves and their families.

1. We are traveling back to Bemidji near the end of June. Pray for safety as we travel 21 + hours with a U-Haul.

Egypt: (From last week)

Early in the morning, several Muslims attacked some Christian homes in a village in Upper Egypt thinking that a Christian man is turning his house into a church. They burned the property and four other Christian homes. Thankfully, no one is killed. However, the situation in that village remains so tense.

Later in the afternoon, Muslim terrorists opened fire at Fr. Raphael Moussa, Coptic Orthodox priest of St. George Church in Arish, Northern Sinai. He died immediately. Fr. Moussa leaves behind his wife and a son. May God's spirit comfort them! The predecessor priest was also assassinated in 2012. This area of Egypt is extremely dangerous.

An hour later, Rev. Essam's wife was at a Christian retreat center in Alexandria when her son (five years old) drowned in the swimming pool. Essam was my ex-student and he is the minister of a Presbyterian church in Upper Egypt. This tragedy hit us all. My heart is heavy!

Please pray for these difficult situations. Pray that God will show his mercy on those who suffer.



Calls: Uruguay

Please pray for Lucas. We were hoping to get them home from California next week to finish his treatment here. The doctors had thought that would be fine. But today he contracted a 102 fever and is now being admitted to the hospital in California. Our immediate future plans are now up in the air.

We will be waiting for the results of his urine analysis to see whether he has an infection and what kind of bacteria it would be. Those should be ready Thursday by the end of day.

VBS is this week. We only had one boy and his mom besides the 6 missionary kids. But they suddenly left part way through. We don't know why. This is our first VBS and we are new in the community, so we didn't expect a large turnout. But we are hoping for more tomorrow. One huge issue is the heavy and constant rain. Uruguayans don't go out in the rain unless they have to.

Please continue praying. Our short term team has helped us pass out around 2000 flyers.

Pray also for our family. Almost 1/2 are in the U.S. We really, really miss them. Pray that the Lord will bring them back soon. Pray for healing for Lucas. Pray the Lord will protect his left kidney. The right one is almost useless.

MISSION TO MAIN STREET REPORT
Thursday evening, July 7, 2016

Both of our two teams separately met a Calvinistic Baptist minister who follows Sinclair Ferguson, Joel Beeke, and others of our friends. He prayed with each team for a harvest of souls, but the Lord seemed to send us more scoffers and foggy religionists than usual. When two men speaking German sped by we cried "Deutsch Sprechers!" in hopes of giving them our German language tract. Without slowing down, they turned around and shouted something about "Fussball!" We talked at length with two men, one of whom (a Presbyterian from Ohio) said he'll get into heaven because he is "a h--- of a fine fellow." Before we could discern whether he was joking, the other man chimed in with a most unambiguous agnosticism, claiming it doesn't matter what path to God one finds, but he should keep it to himself--and that he took offense to our trying to "cram religion down his throat." He said he employs fifty people who depend on him, and providing incomes for them is his "good work." He brushed aside our efforts to talk about Jesus, but did accept our fulfilled prophecy handout and said he'd read it. We met a twenty-something couple who listened attentively. At one point the young man interrupted, saying he wanted to know "who created God." We dealt with that quickly and resumed the gospel. They sort of said it's what they believed, but weren't definite. More encouraging was a couple from halfway to Columbia who did pray with us to receive eternal life through faith in Christ. We gave them literature and told them to tell their Wesleyan pastor what happened when they got home. We met an episcopalian woman doctor who is also a cancer patient and doubting God. She listened to the gospel attentively, at one point commenting that it was not like herself to stand still for such a presentation, but she was. She did not pray with us, but took a gospel pamphlet and gave us contact information. (We wrote her later, and prayed for her.) Another highpoint was a boy, eight or nine years old, who was out with his grandparents, neither of whom appeared to speak English. But the child gave us a humble, but confidently glowing testimony of faith in Christ that warmed our hearts. Apparently his parents are strong believers.

Salinas: Mexico

Dear friends,

Happy 4th of July! Of course, it is not celebrated here, but our United States of America is in much need of our work in prayer. We are dependent on Him at this very critical time!

We also covet your prayers for the work here. We are excited to have this week filled with activities as we have fellow laborers join us from Raleigh, NC to work in construction and in sharing the Gospel. We have 3 presentations scheduled for the puppets. The last is a city wide event where we will be allowed to share God's truth with those that come to listen. God worked this out as only He can.

Also, one of the past elders of the church went home to be with His Lord on Saturday. He had been at one time the chief of security for the county (because of him it was the one time that corruption was not allowed!) He truly was a man of God who even the drug lords felt that he feared nothing. However the fear of God was his. He could not be bought and he used every opportunity he had to share the Gospel. He died and was buried in Acapulco but we hope to have a memorial service for him at the church when his wife returns! It would be wonderful if we could have those that were in his political party attend. God could use the testimony of His faith in God to speak to many hearts! Please pray that this will be possible. With God nothing is impossible.
