
Pregnancy Medical Clinic continues to grow and serve our com-

our Sanctuary piano exclusively for our worship music. We hope to have the organ back in working order by Sunday, September 3.

Since we have an exceptional piano why go to the work, trouble, and expense of repairing our organ? You might even wonder why we, or any church, use pipe organs at all. In fact, many churches are jettisoning the use of organs in public worship thinking them old-fashioned and irrelevant.

First, we use the organ because it is the most "vocal" of all accompanying instruments, and therefore the best suited to lead and undergird the singing of the gathered people of God. The organ uses the same processes as the human voice to create sound: energized air passing through a wind pipe, vibrating a resonator, creating a tone. In fact, many of the components of the pipes themselves have names related to the human body: mouth, spine, foot, tongue, ears, toe, etc., the name "organ" itself is a physical term. The tone produced is a naturally occurring sound, neither electronically produced nor pre-recorded; it is real, tangible, and authentic, needing no amplification. This vocal quality of the organ is one of the main reasons it is so valuable and effective in supporting singing.

Second, the organ has the capacity to sustain sound, again like the human voice, unlike any other instrument. This may seem a minor point, yet in practice is a major feature. When we become overwhelmed by the grace of Christ in our lives and can sing no more, when our voices falter in illness, fatigue, or age, the organ is supporting and enabling our song, encouraging us to heed and obey the many commands of Scripture to "sing to the Lord a new song," to "come before His presence with singing," to "lift up a song to Him," to "sing Psalms, hymns and spiritual songs," and to "sing praise to His glorious name." The organ encourages and assists the worshiping congregation to sing "glorious praise" to our glorious God!

Thirdly, the organ has wide dynamic range and color, from the softest whispers to the grandest fortes, outfitted to lead a congregation in singing, to accompany a choir or soloist, as well as to stand on its own as a solo instrument. The pipe organ is the only instrument capable of producing the sheer scale of volume needed for these purposes--all without amplification.



It is for these, and many other reasons, that David or myself will be glad to share with you in person, that I firmly contend the organ is the best suited instrument to lead and bolster our congregational singing, all to the praise and for the glory of our Almighty and Triune God.

August is also the month when our music ministry transitions into a fall schedule. Both the Chancel Choir and Youth Ensemble are in need of additional singers and this month is a great time to jump into the music ministry of Second Church. If you have been looking for an opportunity for you, and/or your, children to join – NOW IS THE TIME!!!

Next Wednesday evening, August 16, the Chancel Choir resumes fall rehearsals from 7:30 to 9:00 p.m. in the choir room, and the following week, August 23, the Hope Choir (K-4 to First grade), Covenant Choir (grades 2-6), Youth Ensemble (grades 7-12) begin their rehearsals. These choirs meet each Wednesday evening from 6:15 to 6:55 p.m.

# Letter from the Music Director

Shout for joy to God, all the earth; sing the glory of His name; give to Him glorious praise! Psalm 66:1-2

For centuries the Church has utilized the pipe organ to accompany the singing of the people of God. The organ has long been established as the ideal instrument to compliment congregational singing. Because our organ serves such a vital role in gathered worship here at Second Church, readily apparent to member and visitor alike, difficulties arise when the instrument is not functioning properly.

For several years problems have been developing in our aging organ, a 1970's Moller electro-pneumatic pipe instrument. Due to metal fatigue several of the larger pipes are collapsing under their own weight and are leaning against other pipes, creating rattling and buzzing sounds, and need extensive repairs. This problem is attributable to a flaw in production, and if left unaddressed will lead to an inevitable collapse and costly damage to the surrounding pipes. Further repairs and corrections need to be addressed in the future, but this one is the most critical. Our outstanding organist, Dr. David Coleman, has been able to compensate for many of these problems but is finding it to be a greater and greater challenge.

This week the first of the necessary repair measures began. Many of the pipes were removed from one of the organ chambers and transported to the Lincoln Pipe Organ Company's workshop in Lincoln, NC. The repair work will take approximately three weeks rendering our organ inoperable for the remaining Sundays in August. On these Sundays we will be using
