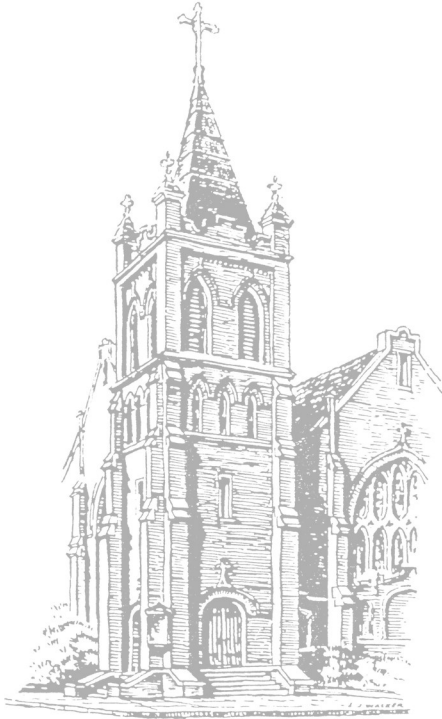

<sup>18:28</sup>So the king of Israel and Jehoshaphat the king of Judah went up to Ramoth-gilead. <sup>29</sup>And the king of Israel said to Jehoshaphat, "I will disguise myself and go into battle, but you wear your robes." And the king of Israel disguised himself, and they went into battle. <sup>30</sup>Now the king of Syria had commanded the captains of his chariots, "Fight with neither small nor great, but only with the king of Israel." <sup>31</sup>As soon as the captains of the chariots saw Jehoshaphat, they said, "It is the king of Israel." So they turned to fight against him. And Jehoshaphat cried out, and the LORD helped him; God drew them away from him. <sup>32</sup>For as soon as the captains of the chariots saw that it was not the king of Israel, they turned back from pursuing him. <sup>33</sup>But a certain man drew his bow at random and struck the king of Israel between the scale armor and the breastplate. Therefore he said to the driver of his chariot, "Turn around and carry me out of the battle, for I am wounded." <sup>34</sup>And the battle continued that day, and the king of Israel was propped up in his chariot facing the Syrians until evening. Then at sunset he died.

<sup>19:1</sup>Jehoshaphat the king of Judah returned in safety to his house in Jerusalem. <sup>2</sup>But Jehu the son of Hanani the seer went out to meet him and said to King Jehoshaphat, "Should you help the wicked and love those who hate the LORD? Because of this, wrath has gone out against you from the LORD. <sup>3</sup>Nevertheless, some good is found in you, for you destroyed the Asheroth out of the land, and have set your heart to seek God."
