But it is not a humanitarian project; it is a mission ministry. Ultimately, the objective of Sándor and István and all the workers is to bring those they care for under the Word of God, into a Christian community where the Bible is studied and applied to life. The CE Center is a hub where 12 Bible study groups meet regularly. Here is a reflection written by 17-year-old Anna Virag Dombi who attends the Wednesday Junior Bible study.

A faithful friend is a strong supporter. She finds wealth, she who makes such a friend. A loyal friend simply has no price, no value to him or her. Like a balm of life is a good friend, one who fears the Lord.

For me, Wednesday's junior Bible study group is more than just a youth occasion or Bible study. In this well-attended but more familiar community, we can talk about the Word of God, faith, and all the other taboo things that we only scratch the surface in our family or the school.

It's a real spiritual strengthening just to be in physical contact with people who genuinely care about me, and I know that they pray for me, just like I do for them. It has happened more than once that the Lord has called me through them and made me realize that I have been off the road.

In conclusion, for me, Wednesday's youth Bible study group is an important element of a second family, a community of friends, and the best occasion of deepening my faith.

We are grateful for your support. Without it, Anna likely would never hear of the Saviour, never receive Christian friendship, and "would have no hope and be without God in the world" (Ephesians 2:12). Please pray that as the good seed of God's Word is sown among the marginalized of this city in Romania, it would germinate, spring forth, and bring forth much fruit, to God's glory!

Letter from Addison Maralit Update on Cambodia Mission Trip

08 June 2021

"Soul, then know thy full salvation, Rise o'er sin and fear and care. Joy to find in every station something still to do or bear."

I've never welcomed the heat of the outdoors as much as I did a few days ago. Mark and another doctor picked me up at noon on the 4th and took me to the clinic. We went along the outskirts of the city- it's fascinating! The staff is incredible, funny, and try their best to speak English while I'm around.

They have a nurse and about 6 doctors who all specialize in something different. Mark's specialization is in orthopedics and internal medicine. All the doctors let me follow them around, see patients, and help where I can- I helped sew up a man's head on the first day! Today, Mark graciously let me practice putting in IVs on him. If someone comes in needing surgery while I'm here, Mark will let me help with that too- I'm getting so many opportunities I wouldn't be allowed to back home.

In the afternoon when no patients are there, Mark gives presentations on different types of medicines. I sit in on those and am amazed at the chance to be in a room with so many doctors learning exactly what they are- even if I don't fully comprehend the material.

There are a wide variety of patients that come in each day, but my favorites are the patients who need ultrasounds. One was of a baby, about 5 ½ weeks old, you could see the gestational sac and the heartbeat on the screen! Today, a girl 3 months pregnant came in and I could see the full body and baby

moving around which is so neat.

Last Saturday two girls from the church took me around the city for a few hours. They were super nice, spoke great English, and we had a great time. I met one of the girls for coffee tonight after I finished at the clinic. It has been special to get to know her and spend time together. Any culture will be different, but I'm constantly intrigued by the Cambodian culture. How or what they drive and what they carry driving is very different to say the least. I get handed a lot of food. To decline anything is considered rude here in Cambodia, so I just smile and take it and try not to let my imagination run:) So far, so good- they all cook with lots of spices and peppers, so everything is spicy which I really enjoy.

Unfortunately, the lockdown is back in place (after only a week of it being lifted), so until I'm allowed to go to the church dorms, I am staying at the Ambrose's. I'm glad to be able to help wherever they need and play with their boys (ages 10 and 11), which consists mostly of chess and phase 10. Yesterday, I took the boys to the park in the neighborhood and played with them and some other kids for about 2 hours. The kids here are SO adorable- I wish I could bring them all home with me.

Laura and I went to Grace House on Sunday to drop off some clothes and food for the girls. There are 9 girls there aging 12-17 yrs. We couldn't stay long, but I hope to go again soon. They all have difficult backgrounds, so I'd love to spend more time with them and just be their friend.

The last few days of quarantine were long. I ended up having to stay an extra day at the hotel, but I was encouraged with hymns like "Abide with me" and "Jesus, I My Cross Have Taken" (part of this song is what's bolded at the top), with sermons, and by reminding myself that I wouldn't be in the hotel one second longer than God intended. Keeping my thoughts on Christ and trying to see the time at the hotel as a blessing instead of an inconvenience helped tremendously. I realized a lot of my anxiety was coming from the lack of control I had- when or how the test results would come back and when I could leave. Despite knowing that God's ways are higher and better than mine it was still hard to completely trust it with my heart, but I'm slowly learning.

This is my first full week out in the city. I'm learning so much and beyond thankful for this opportunity to learn and serve here in Cambodia. I can't wait to see how the Lord moves and all the new things I will experience!

Praise God for:

- Sustaining, molding, and growing me during quarantine and for getting out!
- The opportunity to be here and learn and serve.

Prayer Requests:

- For Laura's health to continue to get stronger.
- The language barrier is difficult, so please pray I can catch on quickly.
- For all the relationships I'm starting to form.
- COVID restrictions will be lifted again and cases will go down.

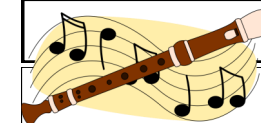
Church Picnic - Saturday, July 3, 2021
