# **RAFIKI** FOUNDATION


*Rafiki* means "friend" in Swahili and depicts the purpose of the Foundation to help people know God and raise their standard of living.

The vision of the Rafiki Foundation is to cultivate a multitude of godly contributors in ten African countries.



# What is the fourth petition?




"Give us this day our daily bread."



# **Wedding Shower**


